At the pitching event you'll present your plan, receive a certificate and perhaps even win a price for the best plan and pitch. Afterwards, you may get the opportunity to receive support from StartLife, Green Office and WEP to actually realise your idea!

You're encouraged to start locally, which means that you have to develop an idea which is related to the campus or your study or working environment. This is very broad; you could think of campus development, biodiversity on the campus, student housing, transport, food and so on. Use your creativity! Afterwards, you can scale up your initiative beyond Wageningen.
